Dr. Aliya Khan: Recipient of Hypoparathyroidism Award

One of Halton Healthcare Services (HHS) local physicians has been recognized internationally for her work and research in the management of hypoparathyroidism.

Dr. Aliya Khan was presented with the International Hypoparathyroidism Award by the Hypoparathyroidism Association at their 8th International Conference in Sacramento, California on June 6, 2014. The award was given in recognition of Dr. Khan's impact on improving the lives of people with hypoparathyroidism and her contribution in advancing excellence in research, education and patient care in this field.

A member of the HHS Department of Medicine, Dr. Aliya Khan is also a clinical professor in the Department of Medicine, Division of Endocrinology and Metabolism and Division of Geriatric Medicine at McMaster University.

Dr. Khan is an international speaker on the diagnosis and treatment of hypoparathyroidism and has published extensively on the condition. She co-chaired the International Conference on Hypoparathyroidism, developed recommendations for practice for physicians globally and served as the editor for the *Handbook of Parathyroid Diseases*, which is one of the most popular textbooks on the subject.

Hypoparathyroidism is a condition in which there is inadequate parathyroid hormone activity resulting in low serum calcium and high phosphorus levels. Signs and symptoms of this condition include numbness, tingling, seizures, muscle cramps, muscle weakness, wheezing, heart failure, and confusion. It can be life threatening and urgent medical treatment is required if the calcium levels are significantly low.
